• *Note:* From the ages of all but the older three children of eleven, John Yeager woujld have to have been born at about this time. Even though he was alive until 4 Oct 1863, no record for him has been found in either the 1850 or 1860 Census records. A family which seems likely his in in the 1840 Census, living in Franklin Twsp, Portage Co, OH. The oldest male is 50 to 60 years of age. ¹

• *Event:* Marriage Abt 1810 Butler Co, PA

• *Note:* From the biography on Captain Thomas Yeager, "Defiance,

Henry, Williams and Fulton Counties" by J. H. Beer & Co, 1899, p. 33²

• Event: War of 1812 Military Service 1812 Beaver Co, PA

• *Note:* Known dates indicate his enlistment was when still living in Beaver Co PA. $\frac{3}{2}$

• *Census:* Ages of family members & fit 1820 Harmonia Twsp, Butler Co, PA

• *Note:* John Yeager and family listed on page 131. Ages fit with known family except for the father, John, whose age is given as 26 to 44. The 2 males 0 - 10 years: Jacob and Francis; 2 females 0 - 10: Catherine and Elizabeth. The mother Elizabeth was 20, as indicated with one listed in the 16 to 25 age group. The next oldest male, whom we may figure is husband John should be in the same group IF we have his age correct in our records or the recordes made an error. This person is listed in the 26 to 44 group. There is also an older male living with the fsmily, listed in the 45 and up category. This might be Elizabeth's father, Daniel Duke who came west with the family, John's father, or some other older relative $\frac{4}{2}$

• *Event:* Left Butler Co, PA Moved Residence 1832 Moived to Union Twsp, Stark Co, OH

• Note:

From a biography on John Snider, "History of Defiance County. Ohio" (see sources) published in 1883. Goes into some detail about Snider's son-in-law, Thomas Yeager and Thomas' family. Gives date of move to Stark County, Union Township.

Yeager would have been about 45 years of age, his wife, (Mary) Elizabeth 42. The two older living children, Catharine and Jacob would have been 18 and 19 years old, old enough to remain or go along with the family. The only information known is about Jacob, b abt 1814 is that he died in 1857. If the John Yager family living in Franklin Twsp, Portage Co, OH in the 1840 Census is "our" family, there are no family members in the age categories to be these two. They may have married and established their own homes on the way.

• *Occupation:* Probably a "sawyer" 1832+ Franklin Twsp, Portage Co, OH

• *Note:* Noting the path this family and others who seemed to move along to the same places at about the same time seems to have coincided with that of the canal builders making tree removal a must. In addition, several of the sons were listed as "sawyers" in the 1850 Census. Later. son John D. and his sons, William E and John Wesley became Saw Mill owners.

• Event: Moved Residence 1842 Moved to Perrysburg, Wood Co, OH

- *Note:* The family remained at this location only two years before moving to Henry County in 1844. $\frac{5}{2}$
- Event: Moved Residence 1844 Near Florida, Henry Co, OH
- *Note:* With the six younger children 16 years old and under, their mother, (Mary) Elizabeth Duke Yeager died in 1845. She had born 15 childen, most of whom lived to adulthood and quite a few to old age.
- Event: Second Marriage 9 Jun 1846 Defiance Co, OH

• *Note:* They were married by the Justice of the Peace, Benjamin B. Abbott $\frac{6}{2}$

• Event: Death 4 Oct 1863 nr Wolcottville, LaGrange Co, IN

• *Note:* John Yeager is buried in the Witmer Cemetery, Grave #5, Lot 104. Listed as Pierce/Witmer/Woodruff south of 700S W of State Road 9". Found and photographed when in northern Indiana.

- Note:

Some biographical sources published late 1800 or early 1900 give place of birth as Butler Co, PA. All agree the family lived in PA at the time their older children were born. Probably Beaver or Butler Cos was where the marriage of John and Elizabeth Duke took place.

After spending four years there our subject's father removed to Wolcottville, Lagrange, Indiana and his death occurred there in 1863 when he had reached the advanced age of eighty-three years." Title: History of Defiance County, Ohio Publication: Warner Beers & Co, Chicago 1883 Text: from a bio on John and Nancy Snider: Lists eleven of their children, all still living, among which is "Mary T. Snider, , born November 6, 1833 (married to Thomas Yeager May 5, 1853)...."

The bio continues with many details on Thomas Yeager and his family:

"Thomas Yeager was born November 9, 1828, in Butler County, Penn. His parents were John and Mary E, (Duke) Yeager, who had a family of fifteen children -- Daniel, died at the age of two years; Catherine, Jacob, died 1857; Mary, died 1865, Francis, was in the army in the late war and had his leg shot off (amputated), and died from the wound at Alexandria. He had enlisted in a Michigan regiment; Elizabeth, John, Rebecca J., Absalom, Thomas, Susan, Andrew, Amelia, Samuel, who married Martha daughter of John and Nancy Snider, who were old pioneers; and Sarah.

"His father was of German desent, his mother Scotch. They moved from Butler County, Penn., when the subject of this sketch was about four years of age, and located in Stark County, in Union Township; from there to Portage County, near the place now known as Kent; from there to Perrysburg, Wood County, in 1842; then to Henry County, in 1844. His mother died there in 1845 aged fifty-four years. His father then moved to Prairie Duemasque, and married Wiidow Shasteen; he then moved to Lagrange County, Ind.

"The subject of this sketch left home at the age of nineteen years coning to Evansport in October 1847, penniless. He received his first schooling by working nights and mornings for the board, thereafter he taught the district school six years, in which he received his education; married Mary T Snider, May 5, 1853, by whom he had five children of whom the following two are living --John A, born December 25, 1856; Nancy E., born June 13, 1858.

"After marriage, he farmed for three years, then engaged in the merchantile business, at which he still continues at Evansport, keeping an excellent general store.

"He enlisted in the army in y\the late war; in June 1863, raised a company for the service (Company E, Eighty-sixth Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry), and went out as Captain of said company on

the six months' call. He served his time, then returned and resumed the mercantile business; he has been very successful, having set up his son, John A., and his son-in-law, A.C. Cameron, in the same business in Evansport.

"Mr Yeager taught school in Evansport in which he received his education, also his son, John A, and his wife, Ella M. Ashbrookm also his son-in-law, A. C. Cameron, and hu\is wife, Nancy E., have alltaught in the same school in Evansport in which they all attended school. Mr. Yeager's wife was a school teacher also, and has taught in this county, but not at Evansport.

"John A Yeager, the first child and eldest son of Thomas Yeager, was born December 25, 1856. He had the advantages of a common school education, and graduated at Valparaiso, Ind. He taught in the district school in his native town (Evansport) several terms, then entered the store of his father as clerk for a time, and then entered into partnership in the same business with his brother-inlaw, A.C. Cameron, and still continues in the same. He wasarried March 23, 1879, to Miss Ella M., daughter of Thomas and Susan (Demorest) Ashbrook, who was born March 16, 1858. They have one child -- Mattie Belle, born Januart 15, 1881." Repository:
